On Friday 23 August, Fotografisk Center opens its doors for the art gallery's large theme and group exhibition Memories with 11 Danish and international artists. The exhibition is part of Fotografisk Center's major initiative, which in the years 2023-2025 focuses on some of the special characteristics of photography as a medium. The series of exhibitions will investigate and discuss the current artistic and cultural role of photography through various themes, and this year photography's connection to memory and history will be scrutinized.

About the exhibition

The exhibition *Memories* shows works by 11 Danish and international artists. There are both internationally recognized artists and new talents, each of whom, with their distinctive artistic practice, shows how a phenomenon such as memories relate to and is reflected in the camera-based art of today.

Since the invention of photography, memories have been inextricably linked to the medium by virtue of its special ability to retain and depict personal as well as collective and historical events. The exhibition explores in different ways how the photographic medium can be both a bearer of memory and a catalyst for retaining or recalling memories due to its ability to perpetuate the past in the present and the future. At the same time, the exhibition explores how memories can also be linked to oblivion or exclusion of other, marginalized or traumatic narratives and perspectives on history.

The works in the exhibition illuminate memories in different ways both materially, through experiments with the materiality of memories or the photograph as a physical object, and thematically in the form of personal or collective memory and history. Other works illuminate the meaning and influence of archives or technology on human memory and remembrance.

The participating artists are: Ikram Abdulkadir (SO/SE), Sune Amstrup (DK), Salih Basheer (SD), Ismar Čirkinagić (BA), Jeannette Ehlers (DK/ TT), Astrid Kruse Jensen (DK), Helene Nymann (DK), Inuuteq Storch (GL), Fiona Tan (ID), Constanza Valderrama (CL) and Danh Vo (DK/VN).

The exhibition and the accompanying publication are generously supported by the Augustinus Fonden, the New Carlsberg Foundation and the Danish Arts Foundation.

Publication and events

In connection with the exhibition, a richly illustrated publication will be published, which unfolds the theme of the exhibition and the works of the artists. Contributors to the publication include i.a. Dorthe Berntsen, professor and director at Center on Autobiographical Memory Research, Department of Psychology and Behavioural Sciences, Aarhus University. The publication will be published during the exhibition period.

During the exhibition period, an event will also be held with a number of the participating artists who will unfold the theme of the exhibition. More details on the launch date of the publication and a detailed event program will be announced on Fotografisk Center's website and social media in August.
